

- The Signatories have not been change over this year we will wait for the AGM next meeting now to start the process afresh
- The question of the changing Banks has been raised as CBA is not as convenient for Cherie in the canteen and Kelly for fundraising. We will see if CBA opens up in the new shopping centre if they don't ANZ Glenmore Park may be a better alternative

### Canteen

- Everything is fine, we still have the usual problem moving towards the end of term where we lean on our regular mums to help cover gaps.
- Looking at introducing a bolognaise dish with spiral pasta
- The Issue with repairing the Ceiling is being explored

### **Fundraising**

- It has been a busy Term 3
- PJ day raised \$526.05
- Disco raised \$2,135.25
- Stage 2 cake stall raised \$844.35
- Fathers Day was a success raising \$1,896.22
- Thank you to all of the volunteers who helped these events run smoothly
- The Disco had a few issues including parents who were not prearranged entering the hall Kelly did ask them to leave
- The boys toilets in the hall were a mess with wet toilet paper everywhere, Kathy Browne says this is a symptom of not enough teachers supervising for 3-6 and the toilets should be checked before the children are let go of. An option to combat this could be to hold the Disco during the school day. Nicole Timbs suggested holding the discos on separate days so the early timeslot is available to all teachers.
- Kathy Browne Confirms that anyone with a Working with Children's check who is aligned with the P&C can enter the hall to help supervise they will be provided with a Pink Teacher Vest to wear.

- The school will continue to take responsibility for the cleaning after these events. If this starts to become an issue then we will revisit.
- Wacky walk a thon: \$2150.00 has been donated by businesses. All letters have gone out to students. Kelly has organised a range of Prizes, Games and booked the BBQ. Mr Chan and Mr Lister Snr are now on board with the organising and setup.
- Back up day is 24/11/2017
- Kelly is looking at an increase in some prices as they have not changed for a long time.
- Kelly has been advertising P&C activities on the noticeboards.

### Uniforms

- Kelly advised that the gift cards purchased at the 20% off day can no longer be used on School Wear.
- The Reminders from Facebook about sales have been good

### PRINCIPALS REPORT

- Next year the school will increase to 22 mainstream classes 565 students a new demountable will be organised
- The school currently has 11 fulltime staff with the rest on some form of part-time. There are a number of positions vacant with Lizzie Chase taking up one continuing with her work with the bump them up literacy. There are also staff moving into leave for various reasons
- There will be 4 new staff comprising of an AP and 3 Classroom teachers.
- Validation was a success with the process showing the school is sitting at the levels we believed it to be the results will be published in the newsletter.
- The current Term has been plagued by Illness both with Staff and Students
- Parents will not be able to choose their preferred teacher for next year only cases where peer issues exist will be considered
- Belinda Rushbrook has mentioned that the P&C is not a governing body within the school this comes about with an increase in parents approaching members with issue that should be bought to teachers. It was agreed that when this happens we are to refer the parent to the appropriate staff member.
- NAPLAN results for yr 3 in particular where very good showing the bump it up program is working Nicole Timbs has asked that the parents are reminded to keep these results safe for future uses such as applications to high school.
- Natural Grass will go in during the holidays approximate cost \$32,000.00
- The Sandpit area Kathy has received 2 quotes the first was \$8216.00 for the supply of sand and decking area. The second quote Gth Landscapes Geoff Harder 0411 316 911 Suggested the current formwork for the sandpit was not good enough for \$8,670.00 he will Form it, Deck and provide sand. Belinda Rushbrook moves the P&C pay for the second quote amount Kelly Touma Seconds
- There is an issue with Parents abusing the payment system by waiting until the due date or after and then abusing the staff in the office if they are unable to pay for their child late. While the staff in the office would like to include all children by accepting these late payments problems are caused with the organisation of these events. Kathy has asked if the P& C will support her taking a harder stance on these due dates and we all agreed it was necessary.

### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

- Yr 6 mini fete will not be mufti the children with stalls that may wet participants will provide ponchos
- Kindy Information night is 15/11/2017
- 2018 School items are being organised by Pricilla Quinlan with Torstar and stage teachers they are in the process of figuring out what is needed and pricing. Belinda Rushbrook has asked if the info can be communicated to the parents when it is available in the newsletter so parents can start

buying Nicole Timbs has asked if the requirements from parents regarding covering etc. can be uniform and she also suggested Torstar come to the school before the end of the year to sell the packs onsite.

- Glenda, Belinda and Kylie have questioned this year's statement for voluntary fee as the parents were under the impression that this was not going to be asked this year with the purchase of the book packs. It has been asked that in 2018 there should be a letter that says that there will be a voluntary fee asked for the year; it's just a bit of a softer approach.
- Kylie Hoegel would like to ask about the yr 4 excursion to the beach. The original excursion was going to cost too much at \$100 for the day. The current water awareness excursion will be focused on water safety at the beach the providers will have a ratio of 1:8 the students will wear red rashies and will only be at the edge of the water not swimming. There will also be extra teachers travelling with the children.
- Kathy is looking at options for an overnight excursion for stage 2 one option would be an Overnight stay at School.
- Nicole Timbs would also like the Newsletter to be available online when the front page goes home, she also commented that the tell them from me link on the facebook page is being buried and it was suggested that it be pinned to the top.
- Robyn Koen says that Allison Norish has approached Woolworths Glenmore Park asking if they would be willing to support the school they have confirmed they would like to do that. We would need to make an appointment with the store managers to let him know what we need but they are happy to help including resuming the free fruit for the canteen.
- Kathy Browne has asked for ideas on how to spend community money the school has in reserve to encourage our parent community to be involved with the school.
- The Teachers Celebration for the achievement of their goals will be held on 20/11/2017 4pm til 8pm at Twin Creeks P&C are invited.




