A note from the Kindergarten teachers:

Our priority over the coming weeks is your child's wellbeing and mental health. Please do not feel that **ALL** of the activities in this timetable need to be completed. We understand that your children may also be feeling anxious, scared and unsure about the coming weeks and quality time with family is more important than their academic progress during this time.

Your child might need help from a parent/carer to complete the following activities. The activities can be completed in an exercise book or on paper that you have at home. Could you please label the activities with the date to keep track. Additional resources such as taught sounds, InitiaLit Tricky Words, Magic Sight Words, and an Activity suggestion grid can be found at the end of this document.

We understand that many parents are working from home and many families have older siblings using the digital devices. These activities have been chosen to be able to be completed without the use of devices. This will hopefully eliminate the need for having Kindergarten students continually on a laptop/computer or in front of a screen during the week. At this point, any physical work can be brought to school after face-to-face learning resumes. However if your child would like to submit any photos of their work to their teacher during the week this can be done through SeeSaw.
